Rick Doucet represents the riding of Fundy-The Isles-Saint John West. He was reelected to the 58th Legislature in the provincial election held September 22, 2014. On October 7, 2014, he was sworn in as Minister of Economic Development

and Minister of Agriculture, Aquaculture and Fisheries, as well as Minister responsible for Opportunities NB and for Trade Policy. He also serves as vice-chair of the Jobs Board.

He was first elected to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick in the June 9, 2003, provincial election. He was reelected on September 18, 2006, and served as Minister of Fisheries. On September 27, 2010, he was reelected for a third term and was the official Opposition Critic for matters related to Transportation and Infrastructure, and later in his term, Energy.

Mr. Doucet is a past chair of the Standing Committee on Public Accounts and a past member of the Standing Committee on Estimates. He has also served on the standing committees on Privileges and Crown Corporations, and sat on the Select Committee on Public Automobile Insurance. He is also a past Official Opposition Critic for interests related to Agriculture, Aquaculture and Fisheries.

Born in Sussex, Mr. Doucet is a graduate of Rothesay Collegiate School and Holland College, in Business. He worked in the airline industry, gaining experience in areas from sales to the flight deck, before returning to New Brunswick to work in the family retail business. As a business person, he was also involved in the food service industry, operated an advertising agency, and provided flight tours.

Mr. Doucet is a past member of St. George town council, president of the St. George Rotary Club, and a member of the RCS Netherwood Board of Directors. He served on the Town of St. George Planning and Advisory Commission. He also served on the board of Canada's Kodak Image Check Program and was president of the Maritime Kodak Dealers Association for 10 years. In 2000, he published a book of photographs, Herring Weirs: The Only Sustainable Fishery.

He enjoys long distance cycling, skiing, scuba diving, all-terrain vehicles, culinary interests, aviation, photography, and spending time with his family and pets.

Matt Whitman, Deputy Mayor Halifax



Matt Whitman was first elected to Halifax Regional Council in October 2012, representing District 13 – Hammonds Plains – St. Margarets. Councillor Whitman was elected Deputy Mayor by his colleagues in November 2015 for a one year term.

Matt is a life-long resident of HRM, currently living in Hammonds Plains. He graduated from St. Mary's University and has spent twenty years as a Finance and Information Technology Entrepreneur. He has been

researching Networking since 1992 and over the past twelve years invented "Reverse Networking".

About District 13

The district stretches from Hubbards to Upper Tantallon along the St. Margarets Bay Road, and then from Tantallon to Peggys Cove. These communities include Hubbards, Queensland, Black Point, Ingramport, Boutiliers Point, Head of St Margarets Bay, Upper Tantallon, Tantallon, Glen Haven, French Village, Seabright, Glen Margaret, Hacketts Cove, Indian Harbour, Peggys Cove Preservation Area and Peggys Cove. Inland, the communities of Hubley, Lewis. Lake, Stillwater Lake, Upper Hammonds Plains and portions of Timberlea and Hammonds Plains, including Kingswood South, are included in the district.

Stephen McNeil, Premier of Nova Scotie



Premier **Stephen McNeil** attributes his core values and strong commitment to public service to his large, close-knit family. Stephen is the 12th of 17 siblings who were born and raised in Nova Scotia's beautiful Annapolis Valley. Before becoming involved in politics, Stephen graduated from Nova Scotia Community College and put down roots in Bridgetown, where he owned and operated a small business for 18 years.

He was inspired to serve his community by his late mother, Theresa, who was the first female sheriff in Canada.

Stephen was elected to the Legislative Assembly to serve the people of Annapolis in 2003. After winning re-election in 2006, he became leader of the Nova Scotia Liberal party in 2007. Stephen served as leader of the official opposition for four years before being elected Premier on Oct. 8, 2013.

In his election-night speech, Stephen said he was inspired by the families he met while campaigning across the province.

"You have told me about your hopes and dreams for a Nova Scotia where your children and grandchildren can prosper. I share that dream," he said.
